

## Short-term study visa

The short-term study route allows non-EEA nationals to come to the UK to undertake a course of study that does not exceed 6 months.

- a) Nationals of the following countries are required to apply for a Short-term study visa in advance of travelling to the UK:

Students will need to ensure they inform officials at Immigration Control that they are visiting the UK for the purpose of study and show the letter issued by the Department. There is no fee attached to entry at the border under this route.
