

# Student visa Nationality changes outside the UK

- This document is intended to provide guidance to University of Cambridge students on the process to reflect changes in nationality to UKVI.
- It has been prepared by the University's International Student Office using screen shots from the Home Office website.
- Students are advised to read this guidance as well as UKVI guidance prior to making an application.
- If you are outside the UK and have changed your nationality you must apply for a BRP replacement single entry visa before returning to the country. This will allow you to enter the UK with your new passport.
- Once you have returned to the UK you will need to apply for a new BRP to reflect your
  nationality change and need to do this within 3 months of returning. Instructions on how to do

- You will need to select your language.
- Confirm visa type select the following:



- Select a country to provide your biometrics here you must enter the country in which you are making your application and wish to provide your biometrics.
- You must also check available biometric enrolment locations for that country.

# Apply for a replacement biometric residence permit visa, or to transfer or replace your visa (vignette) in your passport or travel document

Use this form if you are outside the UK and you need:

- a replacement biometric residence permit (BRP) visa because your BRP has been lost or stolen (this lets you re-enter the UK once within one month of issue)
- to transfer your visa (vignette) to a new passport or travel document
- to replace your visa (vignette) because your name or personal details in your existing passport have changed
- to replace your visa (vignette) because your previous visa has expired (this lets you re-enter the UK once within one month of issue)



Your given name is usually your first name. If you have middle names, include these with your given name. If your name has a suffix (e.g. Jr), include this with your given name. If you have a patronymic name, include it with your given name. You must tell us all your given names.

#### **Conditions**

If your application is successful, there will be conditions on your visa or leave to remain. This will include, for example, whether you are able to work in the UK.

If you stay in the UK without permission:

- You can be detained
- · You can be prosecuted, fined and imprisoned
- You can be removed and banned from returning to the UK
- You will not be allowed to work
- You will not be able to rent a home
- You will not be able to claim any benefits and can be prosecuted if you try to
- You can be charged by the NHS for medical treatment
- You can be denied access to a bank account
- DVLA can prevent you from driving by taking away your driving licence

You will next be asked to complete the declaration and check your answers.

The final sections of the application require you to pay the visa application fee and book an appointment at the application centre you wish to attend.

Once you do this you will not be able to return and edit your application so please ensure that you only progress further once you have checked your answers and are ready to submit your application.

Please note that once you have returned to the UK you will need to will need to apply for a new BRP to reflect your nationality change and need to do this within 3 months of returning.
